

### Seniors Community Conversation Notes: April 3, 2024

## Seniors' Society – Betsy DeClercq

- Spring Dinner Apr. 22 50/50 Draw,
- Whitecourt seniors coming to Jasper
- Arts Jasper no longer viable and dispersing remaining funds to other organizations.
- Senior's Society will make a request to Council to consider appointing a member to sit on their board.
- Pursuit is doing a bus tour for local seniors during Seniors' Week in June.
- JSS willing to put forward a proposal to pay for air conditioning for Alpine Summit residents.
- Betsy and Megan to follow up on this.

# Food Bank – Cristin Murphy, General Manager

- February was the busiest month to date.
- 41% of people coming in have full time work but not full time hours being given
- Coldest Night of the Year (CNOY) fundraiser garnered 18K which will be split between the Jasper Food Bank and Jasper Community Team Society with a portion of proceeds going to the CNOY main organization outside of Jasper.
- Jasper Food Bank was also a recipient of the Oilers 50/50 and will be receiving a portion of proceeds, the amount of which is not allowed to be disclosed. Friends of Jasper National Park will be receiving the funds and then further dispersing to the Food Bank and Jasper Minor Sports.
- Food Bank also just received an access grant to make space more accessible.
- Food Bank continues to stress the difference between their service from that of the food recovery program stressing that confusion between the two could be contributing to the spike in food bank usage.

# Fitness and Aquatic Centre – Jo-Ann Sherlow

- FitAqua has been offering Aquafit to local seniors through a partnership with Décor Hotels. Lots of seniors have been coming out.
- First Aid: full course and recertification opportunities coming in June
- Get to know Gym: this ½ hour free session can walk seniors through how to use the gym safely. There are lots of seniors using the facility.

# Jasper Municipal Library – Traudi Golla

- Informative talks this month on Food gardening/flowers
- April is Pride Month Tween take over. Pride Storytime also happening.
- Later in April, Jennifer Ottaway is doing a talk on being homeless for a year.
- Regular library programming continues all month.
- Lisa to follow up with Jo-Ann about leasing a machine for the gym that could be a trial for seniors.

- Drive Happiness, a program where volunteers drive/accompany seniors to appointments or help them accomplish errands, is looking for volunteer drivers.
